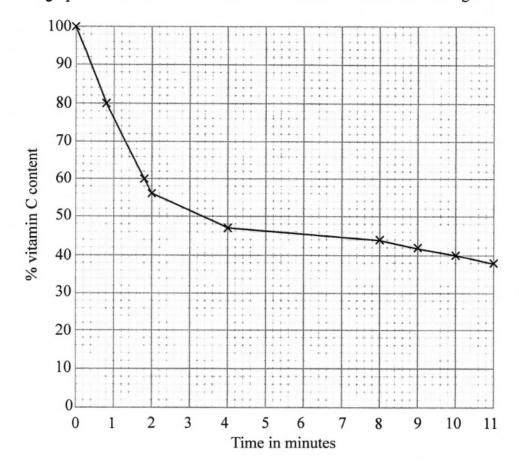

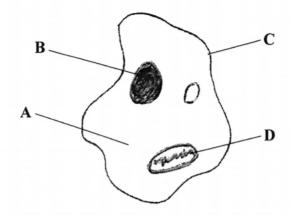

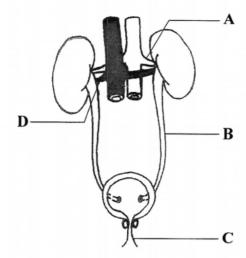

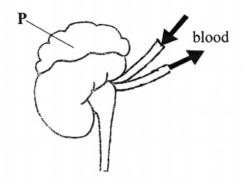

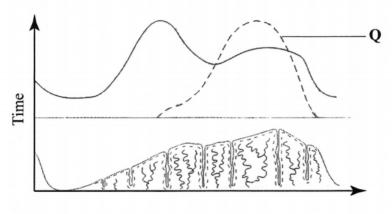

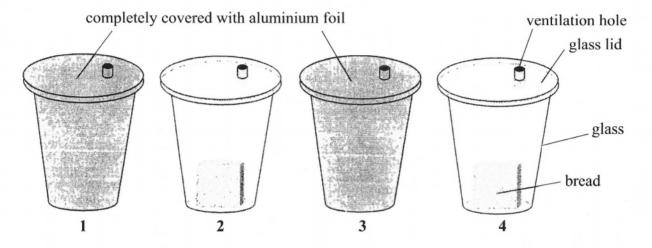
All of the glasses were left in the open for 15 minutes.

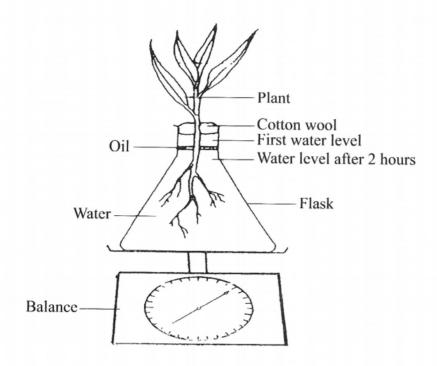

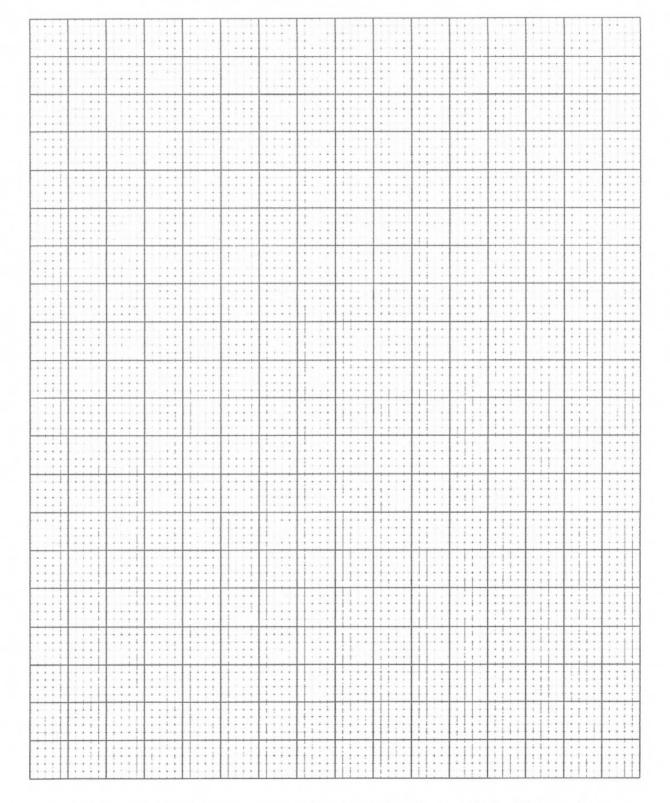

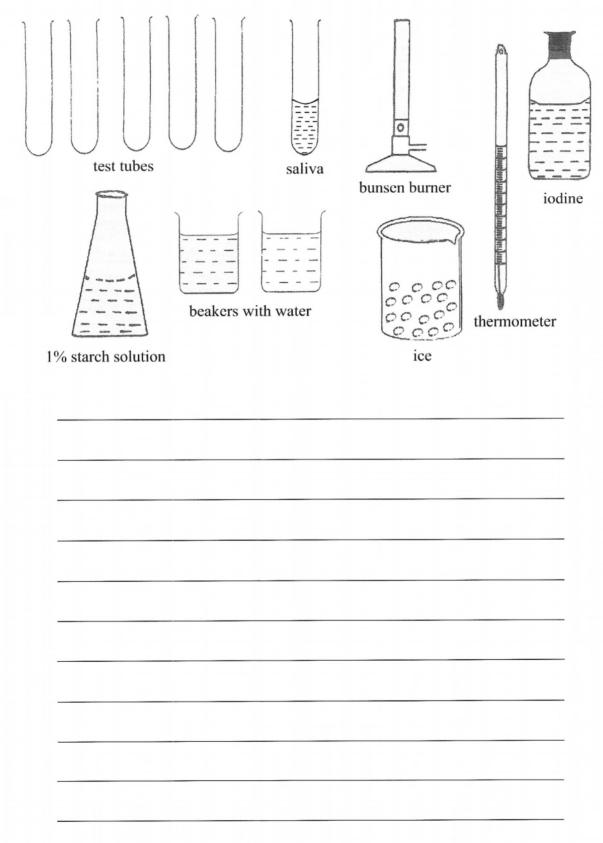
